To make scammers' lives harder by exposing their details and scripts (or "formats" as they're known) to search engines.

Educating the public and thereby removing scammers' sources of income. Scams will continue as long as there are victims. Education is the key.

Helping people to see that, even after being scammed, they CAN move forward and things DO get easier.
